

Avis Borough Council held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, July 6, 2020. Stover presiding with Mayor Harter, and members Raab, Brooks, Gordon, Herman, Aungst and Christian present.

Motion by T. Gordon to accept the minutes of the June 1, 2020 meeting, seconded by J. Raab and so carried with all Council voting in favor.

Motion by D. Aungst to pay the bills as so presented, seconded by J. Raab and so carried with all Council voting in favor.

The bids for the 2020 paving project were opened and are as follows:

A Brooks made a motion to refer these bids to the street committee to go over to make sure they meet the specifications and qualifications and to go with the low bidder if they meet these. Second by M. Herman with all Council voting in favor.

Mayor Harter went over the June police report attached hereto.

J. Raab stated that Pine Creek Township tar and chipped the following: Prospect Avenue, Grier Street and Spring Street. A motion was made by D. Aungst to accept the proposal from Pine Creek Township with a second by J. Raab and so carried with all Council voting in favor.

B. Stover stated that he spoke with the Borough Solicitor, Paul Welch, regarding documents that are being requested by the accounting firm that is preparing the 2019 borough audit. He also asked the sewer collector to provide Council with a job description of the sewer collector.

A. Brooks stated that she is still looking into replacing the doors at the Borough Building. She just wanted to get this on the calendar to get completed this year.

E. Christian just wanted to remind everyone to be careful burning outside and about the blue address signs.

D. Aungst stated that he has had 3 calls regarding no stop signs from the corner of Cliff and Fairview down until Lafayette Street. He said that cars can get going pretty fast down the hill and that is the longest stretch of road in Avis without stop signs. This has been referred to the street committee.

M. Herman stated that the ball team is practicing and playing on the ballfield.

A Brooks stated that there will not be vacation bible school this year. She also mentioned that there are kids riding through the Borough on mini bikes with no helmets and not stopping at stop signs.

Borough resident, Diane Kline expressed to Council her frustration with the fireworks that are going on within the Borough. She stated that something needed to be done about this.
